JU organizes talk on '25th Anniversary of Kargil Vijay Diwas'

The Department of Strategic and Regional Studies (DSRS), University of Jammu, in collaboration with the Jammu Kashmir Study Centre (JKSC) - Jammu Chapter, organized a talk on the '25th Anniversary of Kargil Vijay Diwas' today. The event featured distinguished speakers, including Dr. Ajay Sharma, Assistant Professor at the Central University of Himachal Pradesh, and Dr. Jai Bhawani Singh, Assistant Professor at the Central University of Jammu. Col. (Retd.) Ajay Raina, a veteran of the Kargil War was the Chief Guest on the occasion. Col. Ajay Raina provided an in-depth account of the Kargil War's ground realities, detailing Pakistan's strategies and India's

response. He recounted the contributions of various security agencies and underscored the crucial role of artillery and air force in the conflict. Col. Raina also addressed post-Kargil border management developments and the importance of learning from history to avoid future mistakes. Dr. Jai Bhawani Singh delved into the socio-political dynamics and the nature of the Pakistani state that led to the conflict with India. He emphasized the need to understand the nature of Pakistan, which according to him is a garrison state, driven by an anti-India agenda, and criticized some of the political historians who portray Jinnah as a liberal leader. Dr. Ajay Sharma discussed the formation and recommendations of the Kargil

Review Committee, established on July 29, 1999. He highlighted the pivotal role of the Committee in reshaping India's national security framework, including the establishment of the National Security Council. Earlier Prof. Virender Koundal, Director DSRS, welcomed the speakers and highlighted the significance of Kargil Vijay Diwas. He said the valiant and brave Indian soldiers scripted a saga of valour and registered heroic victory. The event concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Mohd. Monir Alam. Attendees included Advocate Harshvardhan Gupta, Secretary of JKSC; Er. Sahil Sharma, member of JKSC; Dr. Jaspal Singh Warwal, faculty members, research scholars, and students from the university.

Sadhotra assails BJP's double engine Govt's massive power crisis in Jammu

Castigating the BJP's Double Engine Sarkar for depriving the people of even the minimum basic necessities, especially during the ongoing humid and scorching monsoon across Jammu region, Former Minister and National Conference Additional General Secretary Ajay Kumar Sadhotra today expressed serious concern of erratic power supply and drinking water scarcity. In a statement, he said the unscheduled and frequent power cuts have become a norm that results in breakdown in water, little water supply remains available in the Jammu City occasionally and at times after days together.

He described the laxity of the so-called Double Engine Sarkar in meeting the requirements of the people as highly deplorable and inhuman, saying the concerned depart-

ments cannot shirk their responsibilities so casually. Amidst the unbearable humidity and frequent downpours, the government's inability to manage the power supply is causing immense hardship to the people, especially as the unscheduled power cuts have become a daily ordeal, disrupting lives, businesses, and essential services, he added.

Sadhotra referred to the vulnerability of the people, including the elderly and those with health conditions aggravated by the heat and humidity. He also referred to the statement of a senior official, asking the Power Development Department to ensure hundred percent electricity in smart metered areas and better the supply in other places and called it most insensitive diktat, amounting to discrimination with sections of the society. How can a government think in such terms, he asked and said such

administrative tantrums were unacceptable, as the people of all categories, smart metered or otherwise, are equally suffering due to callousness of the government.

On the one hand, there is acute shortage and frequent unscheduled cuts of power and on the other hand, people are being given huge electricity bills under the garb of smart meters. In view of scorching heat and humidity, proper electricity supply is ensured as scarcity of power also affects the drinking water and irrigation water. He alleged that anti-poor policies of the Double Engine Sarkar have created hell for the poor people. Sadhotra urged the government to realise its responsibilities and take immediate steps to resolve the power crisis. It is the government's duty to provide power and caution the concerned departments not to test the patience and resilience of the suffering masses.

JKSA urges AMU VC to reconsider hostel eviction order

The Jammu and Kashmir Students Association here on Friday expressed deep concern and profound disappointment regarding the recent directive by the Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) administration, which mandates PhD scholars who have completed five years of residency to vacate their hostel rooms. The Association stated that this decision has caused significant distress among scholars who are in the crucial stages of their research, either midway through their projects or on the verge of completing their PhD thesis.

Additional Spokesperson of the Association, Zubair Reshi, who is himself a PhD scholar at AMU, voiced the sentiment of affected scholars, and said, "Such a harsh directive has never been seen in the history of AMU. This order has exacerbated the already distressed conditions of scholars, who have lost approximately two years of research due to the COVID-19 pandemic." These two years, marked by unprecedented disruptions, have inflicted a considerable mental toll on scholars, who are striving to regain their aca-

ademic footing. In light of these disruptions, it is important that the administration demonstrates empathy and understanding towards the extended timelines that scholars now face.

Reshi noted that AMU Vice-Chancellor Prof. Naima Khatoun had instructed the vacating of various hostels during summer vacations. She has been inspecting the hostels for the last seven days, while the Registrar and Proctor had sealed dozens of rooms in many halls, including SS North Hall. The students have voiced that they should be allowed to stay in the hostel until they submit their PhD thesis. He emphasized, "Five years have been completed. Now the oral examination is to be held."

He demanded that the hostel should not be vacated until their oral examinations are completed. The association stressed that this decision will cause considerable inconvenience to the students. Female scholars, in particular, are receiving incessant calls from hall authorities, urging them to vacate their rooms. This relentless pressure is not only disrupting their academic work but is also deteriorating their mental health.

Moreover, forcing female students out of the secure environment of university hostels without a clear plan for their accommodation and safety is both irresponsible and alarming, he said.

Reshi asserted that the university administration's failure to manage illegal accommodations has led to this situation. Vacating the hostels amid 50-degree temperatures poses severe hardships. "The administration is deliberately troubling the students," "Where should students go after leaving the hostel?" he added. The association raised grave concerns regarding the safety and security of 1500 J&K students, who are vulnerable and often face unique challenges.

The order to vacate hostels has raised significant concerns about the safety and security of scholars from Jammu and Kashmir. The directive to vacate their rooms immediately, without any provision for alternative accommodations, has created an environment of anxiety and insecurity. It is crucial that the administration takes these specific vulnerabilities into account and acts in a manner that ensures their safety and well-being, it added further.

good seeds that meet the prescribed standards.

Furthermore, the Deputy Commissioner stressed that the department must ensure that the seeds and fertilizers are sold at the rates fixed by the government, preventing any unfair practices that could burden the farmers. The progress under FPOs and the role of FPOs for the benefits of farming community was also reviewed and he stressed on the improvement of working of FPO & directed to review the functioning & performance of CBBO responsible for the handholding & strengthening of FPOs in the district.
