Bhupinder, Dr Abid hold joint review on progress of additional block at Bone & Joint Hospital Sgr

Secretary Public Works (Roads Department & Building) Bhupinder Kumar and Secretary Health & Medical Education, Dr Syed Abid Rasheed Shah today convened a joint meeting to oversee the timelines for the completion of the additional block at Bone & Joint Hospital Srinagar, funded under the World Bank's Jhelum-Tawi Flood Recovery Project (JTFRP).

The new unit is a vital component of the JTFRP aimed at bolstering healthcare infrastructure and services in the region. The meeting was attended by Principal & Dean of Government Medical College Srinagar Prof Dr. Iffat Hassan, Managing Director JK Medical Supplies Corporation Ltd. Principal & Dean GMC Srinagar, Dr Iffat Hassan, in her presentation, provided an update on the current status of the project, highlighting that the originally planned 120-bed

block has been expanded to accommodate 160 beds, including a 6-bed ICU and two private wards.

The facility will also feature advanced amenities such as 12-bed pre-op and post-op rooms, 3 modular OTs, radiology, physiotherapy, faculty rooms, earthquake protection using dampers, pneumatic tube transfer system, hospital information and management system, and minimum IBGC Gold Certification.

The meeting conducted a

comprehensive review of the project's physical and financial statuses, revealing that between 85% to 100% of physical works have been completed. Financially, the revised project cost stands at Rs 116.38 crore, with Rs 75.2 crore already expended and Rs 4.7 crore as mobilization advance. Civil works have achieved 96% completion, with overall project completion nearing 90%.

Secretary PWD, Bhupinder Kumar, emphasized the need

for expedited efforts from executive agencies to ensure timely completion of all pending tasks, underscoring the importance of delivering a state-of-the-art medical facility to the public.

District Cooperative Development Committee reviews implementation of various GOI initiatives in Doda

The District Development Commissioner (DDC) Doda, Harvinder Singh, convened a crucial meeting of the Cooperative District Development Committee (DCDC) to assess the progress and implementation of the world's largest Grain Storage Plan within the cooperative sector.

The meeting, held in the chamber of the Deputy Commissioner, aimed to ensure seamless execution and efficient monitoring of this ambitious project.

During the meeting, the Deputy Registrar of Cooperative Societies, Nisaki U1 Farooq, presented a detailed overview of possible land selection for setting up the food storages.

Discussions also covered the establishment of Jan Aushadhi Kendras, Kisan Kendras Samriddhi (PMKSKs), fertilizer shops, and the computerization of PACS (Primary all Agricultural Cooperative Societies) under the cooperative sector.

The DDC directed the creation of a project to support the activities of all PACS under the cooperative sector and asked for the target of FPOs (Farmer Producer Organizations) to be



achieved within the month. The DDC also directed the concerned officers to find a solution for the land required for setting up the food storages within a week.

Detailed discussions were held on the formation of FPOs and the establishment of food processing units. The Deputy Registrar informed the chair about two FPUs that are under process.

The meeting was attended by key officials, including Additional District the Development Commissioner, Pran Singh, Chief Animal Husbandry Officer, Deputy Registrar of Cooperative Societies, Nisaki Ul Farooq (who served as the convener), Assistant Director

(FCS&CA). Assistant Director (Fisheries), District Development (NABARD), and representatives from various agricultural and cooperative organizations

Discussions focused on the current status of the project, challenges encountered, and strategies to overcome them. Emphasis was placed on enhancing coordination among different departments to expedite the project's implementation. The committee also deliberated on potential directions for future actions, including optimizing storage infrastructure, improving logistical support, and ensuring the quality and safety of stored grains.

JKRERA inspects Real Estate Projects, issues notice to defaulter

A team of officers under the directions of Chairperson, JKRERA, Satish Chandra, and Member, Virender Singh Pathania, today conducted a thorough inspection of various real estate projects in the region to ensure compliance with the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016.

The inspection team, comprising Undersecretary RERA Esha Chib, Tehsildar RERA Megha Gupta, Naib Tehsildar RERA Gias-ul-din and JE RERA Amit Verma, assessed the projects' adherence to the Act and its associated rules. The real estate projects which were inspected by the team included River Castle apartments,

Tawivihar, Sidhra, Tawi Apartments, Mass Housing Building Corporation Limited, Palm Riviera, Sidhra and Royal Nest Sapphire, Kunjwani.

A primary focus of the inspection was to safeguard the interests of homebuyers besides making the builders/promoters aware about the various provisions of the Real Estate (Regulation and

Development) Act, 2016 and the rules and regulations made there under. Following a surge in consumer complaints, the authority has also issued a notice to a real estate developer and directed him to register itself under Section 3(2) of the Real Estate Act. To reiterate, all real estate projects with a land area

exceeding 500 square meters or proposing to develop more than eight apartments must be registered with JKRERA. It is imperative for promoters to understand that advertising, marketing, booking, selling, or inviting purchases for any plot, apartment, or building within a planning area is strictly prohibited without prior registration with the Real Estate Regulatory Authority. The JKRERA remains steadfast in its commitment to upholding the rights of homebuyers and ensuring transparency in the real estate sector. The Authority urges all real estate developers to cooperate fully with the inspection process and to strictly adhere to the provisions of the Real Estate Act.
