On the 25th Kargil Vijay Diwas today, families of the soldiers remember the bravery and dedication of their loved ones who laid their lives during the war between India and Pakistan at icy heights in 1999. Kargil Vijay Diwas, observed annually on July 26, commemorates the success of Operation Vijay in 1999. During this conflict, Indian forces successfully reclaimed strategic positions in the Kargil sector of Jammu and Kashmir that had been infiltrated by Pakistani soldiers and terrorists.

In a stern warning to Islamabad on the 25th anniversary of India's victory in the Kargil conflict, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said Pakistan has been trying to stay relevant by using terrorism and proxy wars and Indian soldiers will crush all terror attempts with full force. Addressing a ceremony at the Kargil memorial in Dras, Modi said "falsehood and terror" were brought down to their knees by the truth in the 1999 war. He also noted that Pakistan has not learnt anything from its past. "Today, I am speaking at a place from where the masters of terror can hear my voice directly. I want to tell these patrons of terrorism that their nefarious intentions will never succeed," Modi said in the presence of India's top military brass.

Condemning terrorism, Modi said Pakistan has always faced defeat in the past and asserted that the evil intentions of terrorists will never be fulfilled. "Pakistan has not learnt anything from its past and has continued to wage war in the garb of terrorism and proxy wars to stay relevant," he said. "Our brave hearts will trample all the terror attempts," Modi asserted. The prime minister also paid glowing tributes to soldiers who had made supreme sacrifices in the Kargil war. "In Kargil, we not only won the war, we presented an incredible example of truth, restraint and strength," he remarked. Kargil Vijay Diwas, the prime minister said, reminds us that the sacrifices made for the nation are immortal.

"The nation is forever indebted and deeply grateful to the mighty superheroes of our armed forces," Modi said. On July 26, 1999, the Indian Army announced the successful culmination of Operation Vijay, declaring victory after a nearly three-month battle on the icy heights of Kargil in Ladakh. The day is observed as Kargil Vijay Diwas to commemorate India's victory over Pakistan. In his remarks at the Shradhanjali Samaroh, Modi said the victory in Kargil war was not of any government or any party. "This victory belongs to the country. Recalling the days of the Kargil war, Modi said he was fortunate to be amidst soldiers back then and added that he still remembers how the soldiers carried out a difficult operation at such a height.

"I salute the brave sons of the country who made the supreme sacrifice to protect the motherland," he said. "India will overcome all challenges that come in the way of development, be it Ladakh or Jammu and Kashmir," he said. The abrogation of Article 370, Modi reminded, will complete five years on August 5 and today's Jammu and Kashmir is talking about a new future full of dreams. Modi gave examples of progress in Jammu and Kashmir and mentioned G20 meetings being held in the union territory.

"This heaven on earth is swiftly moving in the direction of peace and prosperity," the prime minister added. Before his address, Modi remotely carried out the "first blast" of the strategic Shinkun La Tunnel project that will be constructed at an altitude of around 15,800 feet on the Nimu-Padum-Darcha road to provide all-weather connectivity to Leh. "This tunnel will open doors of new possibilities for the development and better future of Ladakh," he said. The prime minister said the tunnel will make the lives of people of Ladakh easier given the numerous hardships they face due to the region's extreme weather. Underlining the government's efforts to boost ease of living and provide more services for the people of Ladakh, Modi mentioned an approximate six-time increase in the budget from Rs 1,100 crore to Rs 6,000 crore in the last five years. "Be it roads, electricity, water, education, power supply, employment, every direction of Ladakh is transforming," he said.

Referring to the ambitious targets for the border areas, the prime minister informed that the Border Road Organisation (BRO) has completed more than 330 projects, including the Sela Tunnel, showcasing "New India's" capabilities and direction. Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said the Agnipath scheme is an example of necessary reforms undertaken by the Army and accused the opposition of playing politics over the recruitment process aimed at keeping the average age in armed forces young. In his address on Kargil Vijay Diwas here to mark the 25th anniversary of victory in Kargil war, Modi said some people were playing politics over a sensitive issue related to national security and rubbished claims that the Agnipath scheme was launched to save pension money.

"The aim of Agnipath is to make the forces young... The aim of Agnipath is to keep the army continuously fit for war," he said. "Unfortunately, such a sensitive issue related to national security has been made a subject of politics by some people. Some people are playing politics of lies for their personal interests even on this reform of the army," he said. The prime minister said Angipath scheme is an example of necessary reforms done by the army. "For decades, there have been discussions in Parliament and various committees on making the armed forces younger. The average age of Indian soldiers being higher than the global average has been a matter of concern," he added. He said this issue was raised in many committees for years but the will to resolve this national security challenge was not shown earlier.

"The country has addressed this concern through the Agnipath scheme," he said. Hitting out at the opposition, Modi said, "These are the same people who weakened our forces by committing scams worth thousands of crores in the forces." He said these people did not want the Indian Air Force to get modern fighter jets and they had "made preparations to lock the Tejas fighter plane in a box." The prime minister also rubbished the claims that Agnipath scheme was launched to save pension money. "Some people are also spreading the misconception that the government has come up with this scheme to save pension money. I want to ask such people, the question of pension for today's recruits will arise after 30 years. Why would the government take a decision today," he asked.

Modi said his government has respected the decision taken by the forces as "for us the security of the country is paramount, not politics." "Those who are misleading the youth of the country... history is witness to the fact that they do not care about the soldiers. These are the same people who lied about One Rank One Pension by showing Rs 500 crore. It is our government which implemented One Rank One Pension and gave more than Rs 1.25 lakh crore to ex-servicemen," he added.

"The Governing Council Meeting on July 27, 2024 will discuss the Approach Paper for the Vision Document on Viksit Bharat @2047... The meeting will also focus on recommendations of the 3rd National Conference of Chief Secretaries held in December last year. During the conference, recommendations were made on five key themes—drinking water: access, quantity, and quality; electricity: quality, efficiency, and reliability; health: accessibility, affordability, and quality of care; schooling: access and quality and land and property: accessibility, digitization, registration, and mutation.

Special sessions were also held to deliberate on cyber security, aspirational districts and blocks programme, role of states, and AI in governance which were also discussed during the National Conference of Chief Secretaries. Meanwhile, chief ministers of three Congress-ruled states -- Karnataka's Siddaramaiah, Himachal Pradesh's Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu and Telangana's Revanth Reddy -- have announced they will not attend the NITI Aayog meeting over alleged bias against their states in the Union Budget. Tamil Nadu Chief Minister and DMK leader M K Stalin, Kerala's CM and CPI(M) leader Pinarayi Vijayan as well as Aam Aadmi Party-led Punjab and Delhi governments have also boycotted the meeting.

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Friday said the government think tank brought by the Modi government should be scrapped and the Planning Commission restored. Banerjee, who is set to attend the NITI Aayog meeting even as most INDIA bloc chief ministers have decided to give it a miss, said she felt their voices should be raised on a common platform. of India since 1947. Despite large conventional wars in 1948 and 1965, followed by infiltration bids and a proxy war of a thousand cuts, Pakistan never reconciled with this reality. The Kargil conflict reinforced the necessity for India to adapt its political and military strategies," Singh said.

Post-Kargil, significant shifts occurred in India's approach, particularly after Prime Minister Narendra Modi took office in 2014, he said. Under his leadership, the political dispensation granted the Army the autonomy to strike back based on their professional discretion and wisdom, the minister said. "This change in strategy was evident in the surgical strikes and the response to the Pulwama attack, where Indian forces proactively penetrated enemy territory to dismantle sources of aggression. The defence budget was also substantially increased, with a notable allocation of Rs 6.22 lakh crore in the interim budget, signalling the government's priority on national security," Singh was quoted as having said in a statement issued by the Personnel Ministry.

India's defence sector, once a major importer, has now transformed into a significant exporter of defence equipment, he said. The identification of 5,000 defence-related items that will no longer be imported marks a significant shift towards self-reliance, Singh said. However, the Kargil War also taught India the importance of vigilance due to the unstable and inconsistent policies in Islamabad and the lack of coordination between Pakistan's political leadership and its military, the ministry said. In Kashmir, post the abrogation of Article 370

and the revised defence approach, there has been a visible restoration of peace, reflected in the heavy turnout of tourists, he said.

The people of Kashmir have realised the tragic loss of three generations over a flawed dream of freedom propagated by vested interests, Singh said. "Today, the youth of Kashmir are eager to seize the opportunities provided under Prime Minister Modi's leadership, recognising the importance of moving forward," he said. As for PoJK, the resolution of 1993 and the unanimously adopted resolution of 1980 clearly state that PoJK is an integral part of India, Singh said. AC approves transfer...

Atal Dulloo, Chief Secretary, Shri Mandeep K Bhandari, Principal Secretary to Lieutenant Governor were present in the meeting. A total of 3188 kanals and 8 marlas of land has been transferred to Industries and Commerce Department for the said purpose.

The transferred land parcel includes 114 kanals and 03 marlas of land in district Kupwara, 1000 kanals of land in district Bandipora, 1094 kanals and 16 marlas of land in district Anantnag, 375 kanals and 06 marlas of land in district Pulwama, 240 kanals of land in district Baramulla and 364 kanals and 03 marlas of land in district Budgam. Development of Industrial infrastructures has been a focus area post-2019 and has been considered as main vehicle for accelerating economic activity besides providing employment. Industries & Commerce Department has come up with various initiatives for setting up industries in the UT of J&K. In order to carry out activities effectively for attracting investment, the main requirement is to make land available to the Industries & Commerce Department. The land transferred thus, shall enable establishing Industrial Estates for overall development of the area and creation of various employment opportunities.

The Administrative Council which met here under chairmanship of Lieutenant Governor, Shri Manoj Sinha, approved amendments in the Jammu and Kashmir Industrial Land Allotment Policy 2021-30. While firming up the changes, the Industries and Commerce Department has included views and comments from stakeholders for effectiveness in updation of existing policy. Based upon feedbacks, amendments have been incorporated to elucidate different clauses of the existing policy with a view to provide simplification of processes and efficiency in land allotments. Periodic revision of lease premium, wide publicity for inviting applications, allotment of land on competitive merit basis, analysis of applicant/promoter/companies background including qualification and experience, sector specific evaluation criteria for sector specific allotments, functions and jurisdiction of land allotment committees, timelines for restoration of cancelled allotments etc have been provided in the amendments to the policy.

To encourage large investments having strategic importance to economy of UT, Government may allot land on preferential basis to mega projects viz. industrial/service sector units with minimum capital investment (excluding land and working capital) of at least Rs. 4000 crores. The amendments shall ensure equity and transparency amongst applicants. The amendments in the Jammu & Kashmir Industrial Land Allotment Policy, 2021-30 shall help in realizing large investments and this will be a fillip to employment generation in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir.

The Administrative Council which met here under chairmanship of Lieutenant Governor, Shri Manoj Sinha, approved taking up construction of Hostel for PG Boys, Hostel for PG Girls, Bedroom Apartment for married PG Students, Hostel for UG Boys, Hostel for UG Girls, Teaching Staff Quarters, Guest House, Parking, indoor Sports Hall, Non-teaching Staff Quarters, Development of Land, Paver Block, Demolishing and E&M Works at Indira Gandhi Govt. Dental Hospital at Amphala Jammu. The Council accorded approval for taking up the project at an estimated cost of Rs. 42.50 crores. These assets shall enable efficient functioning of the Dental institute with adequate facilities to the faculty and students to bring the Institute at par in ranking with the colleges of national repute.

The Administrative Council, which met here under chairmanship of Lieutenant Governor, Shri Manoj Sinha, accorded sanction for construction works of Government Medical Colleges in Kathua, Doda, Anantnag and Baramulla. The proposals were revised keeping in view the constraints like distance, location specific designs, development of land etc. The revised approvals shall enable expeditious funding for development of site and logistic services as well as essential components such as road connectivity, water supply, power, construction of protection walls, development of HVAC, accommodation requirements for construction of male/female hostels for residents, interns etc. The decision shall ensure smooth functioning of the Medical Colleges and provide tertiary healthcare to the public living in peripheral areas of Kathua, Doda, Anantnag and Baramulla districts in the coming days.

'Unprecedented fiscal mismanagement'...

said in a statement. "It is our sincere hope that the next J&K budget is presented in the J&K legislature, by an elected Finance Minister, and discussed by legislators elected by the people of J&K," he said.

The tragedy of the Union finance minister's presentation of the Budget aside, the Budget documents also reveal some astonishing details, Ramesh claimed. "The FM got approval from Parliament to borrow Rs 12,000 crore last year. This year, Budget documents reveal that the actual borrowings were twice the amount, at Rs 24,000 crore. Borrowings have risen five-fold in the last two years. This is unprecedented fiscal mismanagement," he said. Last year, the finance minister promised to raise Rs 7,800 crore in Additional Resource Mobilisation (ARM) and managed to raise only Rs 1,000 crore, he said.

"The fiscal deficit which was pegged at 1.6 per cent has turned out to be 5.36 per cent in FY24 - more than three times the original estimate. Capex has been slashed by 10. Meanwhile, under the Union Government's tutelage, the share of J&K in national GDP has declined from 0.9 per cent in 2015-16 to 0.8 per cent in 22/23," Ramesh said. Posing questions to the finance minister, the Congress leader asked how does the grim reality of the state's finances square up with the tax/GDP ratio of the state increasing from 5 per cent to 8 per cent in three years.

"Are the people of J&K being subject to heavy taxation without any corresponding increase in their welfare," he asked. Since the government takes great credit for fiscal prudence at the national level, will it take the blame for this fiscal profligacy at the state level, Ramesh added. "The unemployment rate in February 23 in J&K was 17 per cent compared to 6.6 per cent in Andhra and 12.3 per cent in Bihar. Why has the FM chosen to be benevolent to AP and Bihar, but not to J&K,"

he asked.

He said the last, and perhaps the most "worrying development" is the finance minister's announcement that "the Union Government has agreed to take the entire burden of the budget of police" in J&K by spending Rs 12,000 crores. "This was earlier being done by the Union Government as part of the Security Reimbursement Expenditure (SRE), since the onset of militancy in the early 1990s. When this is not a unique, new financial obligation, why has it been repackaged from a 'reimbursement'," Ramesh asked.

Has the police salary liability been taken over by the Union government in perpetuity or is it a one-time support, he added. "Does it reflect the government's intention to rule the state from Delhi in perpetuity by retaining the home affairs of J&K with the Union Government? Will the FM commit in the House that taking over police salary liability is not a Trojan horse - and that when J&K is upgraded back to being a state, police and security matters continue to be with the state," the Congress general secretary said.

under Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) Project. Out of the total 272 km of Udhampur Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link Project (USBRL), 255 km has already been completed," Vaishnav said.

He added, "Work has been taken up on the balance stretch of the Katra-Reasi section of 17 km length. Anticipated cost of the project is Rs 41,000 crore, against which, expenditure of Rs 38,931 crore has been incurred up to March 2024 on the project." Saying the USBRL was perhaps the most difficult new railway line project undertaken in the country post-independence, Vaishnav added that the terrain passes through the Himalayas, which are full of geological surprises. According to the Railway Minister, this section predominantly involves tunnelling -- 97.42 km out of 111 km (87 per cent) of Katra-Banihal section is in tunnels and a tunnel, T-49, would be 12.77 km, which will be the longest railway tunnel in the country.

"Railways has made the world's highest railway bridge over Chenab river in Reasi district of Jammu & Kashmir. The iconic Chenab Bridge is 1,315m long having an arch span of 467m and height of 359m above river bed," Vaishnav said. He added, "Indian Railways' first cable-stayed bridge has been constructed over Anji Khad. Its bridge deck is 331m above the river bed level and height of its Main pylon is 193m."

The Railway Minister said that the trial runs with electric trains have been successfully conducted on the Chenab Bridge and a section from Reasi to Sangaldan (46 km) has also been commissioned. "Chenab Bridge is situated between Bakkal and Dugga stations on the Reasi-Sangaldan section. The project is likely to be completed this financial year," Vaishnav added.

633 Indian students...

said in Lok Sabha on Friday. Separately, a total 19 Indian students died abroad due to attacks in the period with the highest of nine deaths reported from Canada followed by six in the US, according to details provided by Minister of State for External Affairs Kirti Vardhan Singh. Out of the 633 incidents of deaths, 108 were reported in the US, 58 in the UK, 57 in Australia and 37 were in Russia, the data showed. Eighteen incidents were reported in Ukraine, 24 in Germany, 12 each in Georgia, Kyrgyzstan and Cyprus and eight such cases were reported in China. "As per the information available with the Ministry, 633 incidents of death of Indian students abroad have been reported in the last five years due to various reasons including natural causes, accidents and medical conditions," Singh said in a written reply to a question.

"Providing safety and security to Indian students abroad is one of the top most priorities of the government of India. Indian missions/posts abroad maintain regular contacts with Indian students enrolled in universities abroad," he said. To a separate question, Singh said a total of 48 Indian students have been deported from the US over the last three years. "Reasons for deportation are not officially shared by the US authorities," he said. "Unauthorised employment, unauthorised withdrawal from classes, expulsion and suspension, and failure to report optional practical training employment are some of the possible reasons which could lead to termination of a student's visa resulting in unlawful presence" and eventual deportation," he added.

In a significant move to enhance the functioning and progress of School Management Committees (SMCs) in District Kishtwar, Deputy Commissioner Dr. Devansh Yadav today chaired a comprehensive meeting at the VC room of the New DC Office Complex in Kishtwar. The meeting witnessed the participation of key educational stakeholders, including CEO Kishtwar R.K. Vesheshta, Principal DIET Kishtwar Prahlad Bhagat, Dy CEO Masood Qazi, DNO SMCs Kishtwar, all Zonal Education Officers (ZEOs), Zonal Nodal Officers (ZNOs), and executives from the India Education Collective. The primary agenda of the meeting was to discuss and review the status of various initiatives aimed at strengthening SMCs.

Key points of discussion included an in-depth review of the current status and ongoing efforts to fortify the SMCs in the district, Baseline Survey Status-Evaluation of the baseline survey conducted for the SMCs to understand their current functioning and identify areas for improvement, Orientation Schedule-Planning for the completion of orientation sessions for the remaining SMCs to ensure they are well-prepared to fulfill their roles, Monitoring and Outcomes- Assessment of the monthly SMC meetings, focusing on monitoring mechanisms and the outcomes achieved, Verification by Village Level Workers (VLLWs)-Ensuring the verification of SMC formation and functioning by VLLWs to maintain accountability and transparency, Steering Committee Meetings- Scheduling and planning of upcoming Steering Committee meetings to oversee the progress of SMC initiatives. During the meeting, all concerned participants provided updated figures and information related to their respective roles and responsibilities. This collective sharing of data and insights was instrumental in painting a comprehensive picture of the current state of SMCs in the district. Deputy Commissioner emphasized the importance of collective and collaborative efforts from all stakeholders to strengthen the role of SMCs in Kishtwar. He highlighted the need for a unified approach to address the challenges faced by these committees and to enhance their effectiveness. DC Kishtwar particularly urged the executives from the India Education Collective to develop a comprehensive plan for conducting orientation programs for ZNOs and VLLWs. CEO Kishtwar was asked to frame format for VLLWs who can issue Zero Drop out Certificate for each panchayats.

These sessions aim to clearly define their roles and responsibilities and provide essential training to the implementing officers and officials. Such training is crucial for effective monitoring and achieving tangible results in infrastructure development and educational outcomes through SMCs, leveraging community participation.

In addition, he stressed the importance of bridging communication gaps within the functional system and improving their overall functioning. He called for better communication systems to ensure that all SMCs in the district are well-coordinated and aligned with the district's educational goals.

The Deputy Commissioner concluded the meeting by reiterating the administration's commitment to enhancing the educational landscape of Kishtwar through empowered and effective School Management Committees. He assured all participants that their collective efforts would significantly contribute to the holistic development of the district's educational infrastructure and outcomes.
