Wildlife smuggling foiled in Udhampur: 20 Parrots rescued

As a crackdown on wildlife trafficking, the Udhampur Wildlife Department successfully intercepted an attempt to smuggle 20 parrots on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway in the Samroli area. The operation, carried out during a special naka, led to the detention of an individual transporting the birds without valid documents. Babu Ram, Block Officer of the Wildlife Block Sudhmahadev, Udhampur, revealed that the department acted swiftly on specific intelligence about the smuggling attempt. A special checkpoint was set up at Samroli, where the suspect's vehicle was intercepted. Upon inspection, the parrots were discovered hidden in a cage. The rescued parrots have since been moved to the Tandey Rakh Rescue Centre in Udhampur for rehabilitation and care. Authorities have detained the smuggler, and further investigations are underway to uncover any links to larger wildlife trafficking networks.

District Kishtwar has solved a chilling blind murder case involving the deaths of a woman and her two children in Jisher Drabshalla. Initially reported as an accidental fire, the investigation uncovered it to be a premeditated murder. "On November 11, 2024, a fire was reported at the house of Khursheed Ahmed in Jisher Drabshalla, resulting in the deaths of his first wife, Nazia Begum (35), and their two children, Amina Bano (10) and Rizan Ahmed (5). The victims were tragically burnt alive, It reads, police initially registered an inquest under Section 174 of the CrPC and took the charred remains for post-mortem before handing them over to the family for last rites. However, the circumstances raised suspicions, prompting SSP Kishtwar to form a Special Investigation Team (SIT) for a detailed probe. The SIT, led by Inspector Firdous Ahmed and assisted by PSI Ankush Sharma under the supervision of Dy. SP Dr. Ishan Gupta, conducted a meticulous investigation. They analyzed technical evidence and interrogated multiple suspects. The probe revealed a web of domestic disputes in the household, as Khursheed Ahmed had two wives—Nazia Begum (deceased) and Asma Begum. Through sustained questioning, Asma Begum confessed to the crime before an Executive Magistrate. She admitted to setting the house on fire on November 11, 2024, due to ongoing conflicts with Nazia. Following her confession, the police converted the inquest into an FIR and arrested Asma. SSP Kishtwar lauded the SIT's efforts in solving the case and emphasized that such heinous acts will face the full force of the law. He reiterated the police's commitment to ensuring

In a relentless pursuit against drug peddlers, Jammu Police made a significant breakthrough on 20-11-2024, Police team of Police Station Doman led by SHO Domana under the supervision of SDPO Domana and SP Rural Jammu while performing vehicle checking at Domana naka stopped one Scorpio N bearing registration number JK11H-1122 for checking purpose which was coming from Akhnoor side towards Jammu. A delegation of Indian National TradeUnion Congress (J&K) led by its President Shiv Kumar Sharma called on President JKPCC Tariq Hameed Karra at PCC HQ Jammu and apprised him about the burning issues of daily wage workers, need based, contractual, adhoc and ITI and others engaged by the State Govt. in various departments. Shiv Kumar Sharma and other senior functionaries of the INTUC put forth various demands of the employees working at various categories in Govt., semi Govt. and Private sectors. Their main demands are: i) Monthly regularization of pay of C.P. workers. ii) Those C.P. workers who have completed 7 years service be regularized. iii) Those ITI workers who have completed 5 years service should be regularized.He

requested the PCC President to discuss the issue of community participation workers with the state Govt. in order to solve the most genuine problems of these workers who are providing essential services to the people by working day and night in PHE and other departments.Shiv Kumar Sharma further said that the concerned authorities had engaged thousands of young workers at various level to meet the urgent requirements of the departments, some of them have completed more than 10 years and were waiting for enhancement of their wages. But it was unfortunate that the services of some workers who have been retired/superannuated without regularization and without any retiral benefit to them. And those who were engaged on land basis, too are either denied regularization or stopped wages.

PCC President Tariq

Hameed Karra gave patient hearing to the delegation and said Congress party and INTUC has always advocated the welfare of labour class for their contribution and rise in the socio economic progress of the country. He said that UPA Govt. had brought land mark legislation to the benefit and protect the rights of labour class in the organized and unorganized sector.
