Reasi Police launches verification of SIM card vendor outlets across district

JU's Poonch Campus students gains hands-on exposure to Sericulture innovations

Visits CSTRI, SBRL Bengaluru, CSGRC, Hosur, Tamil Nadu

Students from the Department of Sericulture Poonch Campus, University of Jammu, recently embarked on an educational tour to South India, gaining invaluable insights into advancements in sericulture technology and bridging the gap between theoretical learning and practical applications. At the Central Silk Technological Research Institute (CSTRI), Bengaluru, the students interacted with scientists and technical experts. Dr. Nivedita S., Scientist-D, delivered an engaging lecture on innovations in silk reeling, weaving and processing with a focus on sustainability. Demonstrations by Mr. Sanket Kuge and Mr. Babu showcased advanced reeling technologies for mulberry, tasar, muga and eri silk, emphasizing quality and efficiency. The students also explored modern weaving techniques under Mr. Sumit Kumar and learned quality control from Dr. Brojeswari Das, who demonstrated raw silk testing methods. The group then visited the Central Sericultural Germplasm Resources Centre (CSGRC), Hosur, Tamil Nadu, under the guidance of Dr. V. Nishitha Naik, Director, CSGRC. She emphasized the importance of conserving mulberry and silkworm germplasm for the sustainability of sericulture.



Dr. Raju Mondal, Scientist-B, detailed advancements in plant cytology and mulberry improvement, while Smt. G. Punithavathy, Scientist-D, gave a comprehensive tour of the Sericulture Museum, showcasing eri silkworm rearing and seed distribution processes.

The students also explored the SeriBiotech Research Laboratory (SBRL), Bengaluru, where Dr. G. Subrahmanyam, Scientist-D and Dr. Pawan Shukla, Scientist-D, introduced them to cutting-edge research in sericulture biotechnology. Laboratory trials demonstrated advanced silkworm breeding techniques, disease management and molecular biology. Ms. Harshita Senior Research Fellow, provided a hands-on demonstration of sophisticated laboratory instruments, offering students a practical perspective on modern sericulture research. The visits to CSTRI, CSGRC

and SBRL provided an unparalleled opportunity for students to witness firsthand the integration of technology, conservation efforts and research in the sericulture industry. These interactions and demonstrations are expected to inspire students to contribute innovatively to sericulture and explore sustainable solutions. Dr. Rubia Bukhari, who is accompanying the students, expressed her gratitude to Prof. Rakesh Vaid, Director Poonch Campus for supporting this initiative. She highlighted that such exposure plays a pivotal role in shaping students' academic and professional trajectories. They announced the holding of "Ambedkar Samman March" from Dr Ambedkar Chowk Gandhinagar Jammu tomorrow at 11.30 a.m. onwards to further press the demand for the resignation of Home Minister Amit Shah, as part of nationwide call of the party. Raman Bhalla said that the entire nation is hurt by the insulting remarks of Home Minister in the parliament against the father of Constitution Dr Ambedkar and series of protests throughout the country but the Prime Minister is silent on this issue. The real intentions and mindset of the BJP has come out from the mouth of Home Minister Amit Shah, demanding his immediate resignation. Ravinder Sharma Chief

Spokesperson stated it was on the written request of Congress President and LOP in Rajya Sabha and LOP in Lok Sabha Shri Rahul Gandhi to the Presiding officers of the two houses regarding discussions on the Constitution on completion of 75th year, that the debate was held in the two houses of parliament, during the course of which Mr Amit Shah used the derogatory words against Dr Ambedkar. Instead of expressing gratitude and honouring his great contributions in the framing of the Constitution, Mr. Amit Shah insulted the great personality. The party demanded immediate resignation and public apology by the Home Minister to end the unrest in the country over the issue, otherwise people will not be satisfied less than this.
