Rana reviews winter preparedness of Jal Shakti Department

Asks for prompt response on public grievances, provisioning of additional tankers for each district

Amid the water crisis due to freezing temperatures in the valley, Minister for Jal Shakti Department, Javed Ahmed Rana, today convened a detailed meeting of the Department to ensure that people are provided adequate drinking water without facing any difficulties.

Besides the MLAs from Anantnag (West), Devsar, Kokernag and Sopore constituencies the meeting was attended by ACS, Jal Shakti Department, MD, JJM, Chief Engineers and other Engineers of the Department.

The Minister, exhorted upon the Department to evolve a robust mechanism ensuring swift response to public grievances so that these are addressed within the shortest possible time. He also asked for doubling the number of water tankers for providing drinking water to areas facing deficit in supply. He asked them to furnish the district wise requirements so that same is authorised after ascertaining their genuineness. On the occasion, the Minister took stock of issues raised by the MLAs concerning welfare and development of their respective areas.

They brought up the concerns related to augmentation of certain water supply schemes besides improvement in daily water supply to the people of these areas. The legislators also raised the matters related to completion of some water supply schemes under JJM besides inclusion of works under AMRUT 2.0 for their areas.

The Minister directed the concerned officers for taking necessary steps to ensure early resolution of the same.

ACS, Jal Shakti Department, Shaleen Kabra, presented an overview of the current water supply scenario prevalent all over the valley.

He also enumerated different steps being taken by the department to tide over the water crisis faced due to drastic reduction in discharge of water from the sources. He informed that out of 2050 schemes, 40 schemes had got affected due to recent snowfall at higher reaches or depletion of sources. He revealed that 26 of these affected schemes had been restored by the Department and 14 more are currently being looked after for restoration.

He further informed that 78 government owned and 13 private water tankers had been put into service to supply portable water to the areas where there is scarcity of the same.

DC reviews solid waste management system in Jammu district

Deputy Commissioner Sachin Kumar Vaishya on Monday convened a meeting to assess the progress of solid waste management initiatives under the Swachh Bharat Mission across different blocks of the district.

The Block Development Officers provided updates on the implementation of waste segregation, door-to-door collection and processing in their respective jurisdictions.

The DC called upon the BDOs to accelerate efforts in managing plastic waste, ensuring proper segregation and strengthening household-level waste collection mechanisms. Highlighting the role of community participation, the DC stressed the need for public vigilance to curb improper garbage disposal. He



instructed officials to identify offenders and work with local authorities to maintain cleanliness in villages. Sub-Divisional Magistrates were also directed to coordinate with Executive Officers of their respective municipalities within their jurisdictions to

enhance and streamline waste management operations within a set deadline.

The meeting was also attended by Chief Planning Officer Uttam Singh, Assistant Commissioner Panchayats Shahzada Noor ul Ain, besides SDMs and BDOs.

The State Election Commission, J&K, today issued the Revised Revision Schedule regarding updation of Panchayat Electoral Roll-2025. According to the revised dates issued by the State Election Commission, B R Sharma

in this regard, punching of forms for filing of claims and objections will be done on 26.12.2024 (Thursday), disposal of claims and objections will be done on 06.01.2025 (Monday) by the ERO while publication of final Panchayat Electoral Roll 2025 will be done on 20.01.2025 (Monday).

Pertinently, the Commission had received requests from various districts for extending the date for punching of claims and objections due to receipt of large number of forms (claims and objections) on fog end and their punching was still pending, read the communication.
