### Police arrests 2 drug peddlers in Baramulla; contraband substance recovered

During search, 2.30 grams of contraband brown sugar was recovered from their possession. Vehicle used in the commission of the crime has been seized. 70% Reservation in J&K

### 'Why protest outside Omar's Residence, why not outside Modi,' questions Harsh to 70%, Mr. Singh questioned without realising that its gory

Expressing dismay over the protest held in Srinagar outside the residence of J&K Chief Minister, Mr. Omar Abdullah by various parties including those of NC, PDP, AIP and others, the JKNPP(India) Chairman and Former Minister questioned as to why such protests were not held in 2023-24 against the then govt which had mindlessly enhanced reservation upto 70% with indecent haste. He said that while the new CM, who had assumed office hardly two months back and had also constituted a committee over the subject, was being targeted, the protagonists of the reservation augmentation were never questioned by any of the protesting groups or other organizations.

Maintaining that it was BJP govt at the centre and its proxy rule in J&K which announced to take reservation

as to why such protests were not held outside the residences of Modi and Amit Shah. He said that an insecure BJP which had lost its ground in J&K had contemplated resurrection through appearement and hence did the greatest injustice to the deserving candidates by burying merit under debris of enhanced reservation.

Bitten by the power bug, an insensitive BJP defied even the persistent rulings of SC on a 50% limit on reservation and forced its own will contravening even the fundamental principles of the constitution, asserted Singh.

And rather than insisting for a sound reservation policy leaving due place for merit, the BJP leaders piggybacked on centre's reservation policy to ride their journey to victory, added Singh. He said that intoxicated with power, the self-aggrandising BJP govt indulged in mis-adventurism

moves of heightened reservation could prove counterproductive in the long run. While unemployment had never been an issue for BJP govt, its appeasement policies and its shoot and scoot politics had caused immense damage to body politic of the erstwhile state. Accusing the protesting parties of maliciously targeting the new govt with vicious mendacities, Mr Singh advised them to lodge such protests outside central BJP leadership and their agents in J&K if they were really sincere in their intentions.He said that people were wise enough and no facade of deceptive posturing by any such leaders or political parties could beguile the people. He said that he would volunteer to join any such protest if held in New Delhi against those who conspired to defeat merit in J&K only for promotion of their political prospects in the troubled UT.

## Srinagar Police intensify crackdown on narcotics and drug peddling in year 2024

SRINAGAR, DEC 24:

Police in Srinagar has been conducting relentless crackdown against drug trafficking in the City with the aim to curb the menace of drugs and dismantle the infrastructure

supporting drug trafficking. During the current year (2024), 94 cases under the NDPS Act have been registered in several Police Stations across the district and 156 accused persons involved in peddling and trafficking of narcotics and psychotropic substances have been arrested by Srinagar Police.Pertinently, 26 notorious drug peddlers have been booked under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (PIT-NDPS Act) in different jails of UT of J&K (Central Jails, Udhampur, Bhaderwah, Kathua Kot Balwal Jammu etc) after obtaining the formal detention orders from Divisional Commissioner,

Kashmir on the basis of accused persons through the dossiers prepared by Srinagar police against them.

These drug peddlers have been involved in the peddling of narcotics among the youth of Srinagar on an alarming scale. Besides, they were also involved in several NDPS Act cases of various police stations of Srinagar. Despite several NDPS Act cases registered against them, they didn't not mend their ways after getting bailed out from courts and were brazenly promoting drugs among the youth of the valley, especially in Srinagar, through their illegal narcotics network. Notably, the properties, both movable and immovable, acquired by the drug peddlers through proceeds of illegal trafficking of drugs and narcotics have been attached by the Police under provisions of section 68 of the NDPS Act.

Among these, Police has attached 07 vehicles and 07 residential houses which were acquired illegally by the

narcotics trade. The estimated value of properties attached is Rs 4.47 crores. Besides, 23 bank accounts belonging to these drug peddlers have been frozen in NDPS Act cases. The recoveries of drugs and narcotics made by Srinagar Police include 1.17 kg of Brown Sugar, 2.92 kg of Heroin, 13.13 kg of Charas, 10.16 Kg of Ganja, 2.83 Kg Crystal meth, 44.18 kg Cannabis/Poppy Straw, 284 bottles of Psychotropic substances and 2823 tabs of banned drugs. Moreover, Rs 4,90,696 cash, 17 mobile phones, 01 drone etc have also been recovered from the drug peddlers.J&K Police affirms its steadfast commitment of eliminating drug peddling in the region with the full might of law. We also caution those engaged in this unlawful activity that the long arm of law would catch them sooner than anticipated and every offender will face justice.
