government should work for the restoration of temples, and the temple properties in Kashmir to ensure the safe and dignified return of Kashmiri Hindu community to Kashmir, said Sunil Sethi.J&K BJP Chief Spokesperson Adv Sunil Sethi accompanied by spokespersons Dr. Tahir Choudhary & Balbir Ram Rattan and Media Secretary Dr. Pardeep Mahotra was addressing media persons in a press conference at party headquarters, Trikuta Nagar, Jammu.

While the NC has repeatedly asked for the return of Kashmiri Hindus to the Kashmir in the past, and also during the Assembly elections, it has not yet made any effort to prove its statements, said Sunil Sethi, while addressing the media persons.Suni Sethi said that since the inception of terrorism in Kashmir, the Hindu temples were destroyed, and the properties were occupied by some people. Sunil Sethi also lambasted all those parties who are politicizing the organization of Tiranga Yatra events.
