In few years the world has made historic progress against malaria, saving mil- lions of lives. However, half the world still lives at risk from this preventable, treat- able disease, which costs a child's life every two min- utes.In addition to the above program the artists of BLSKS also presented songs on Drug Abuse “Savdhan Savdhan Nashakhorise bacha

Dogra chair- mandsaid World Malaria Day by celebrating the achieve- ments of countries that are approaching – and achieving – malaria elimination. They provide inspiration for all nations that are working to stamp out this deadly disease and improve the health and livelihoods of their popula- tions. Dogra Also said Malaria is a mosquito-borne infectious disease that affects humans and other animals. Malaria causes symptoms that typically include fever, tiredness, vomiting, and headaches. In severe cases, it can cause yellow skin, seizures, coma, or death. Symptoms usually begin ten to fifteen days after being bit- ten by an infected mosquito. If not properly treated, people

may have recurrences of the disease months later. In those who have recently survived an infection, reinfection usu- ally causes milder symptoms. This partial resistance disap- pears over months to years if the person has no continuing exposure to malaria. Malaria is caused by single-celled microorganisms of the Plasmodium group. The dis- ease is most commonly spread by an infected female Anopheles mosquito. The mosquito bite introduces the parasites from the mosquito's saliva into a person's blood. The parasites travel to the liver where they mature and reproduce. Five species of Plasmodium can infect and be spread by humans.Dr. Dogra also said one should not take any intoxication. It is said that those who are addicted to cig- arettes feel that only their lungs are getting weak or those who drink alcohol feel that this addiction is affecting their liver, whereas it is not so. Any addiction causes more harm to the brain than to the liver, kidneys and

lungs. Intoxication occurs when you consume alcohol or other substances that affect the way your brain works. It affects elements such as your mental abilities, mood, and coordina- tion. By definition, intoxica- tion is temporary and does not necessarily harm your health.The main disadvan- tages of drug addiction. It causes dizziness, loss of con- centration, and indecisiveness in sex. Excessive drug addic- tion causes breathing prob- lems which can even lead to death. If an infected needle is used, it can cause infectious diseases like HIV. Lack of appetite leads to significant weight loss. Smt. UshaRaina, Troupe leader, said in his speech ‘Malaria’ is mostly common during the rainy season, or monsoon season, as it pro- vides ideal conditions for mosquito breeding. The increased rainfall and humid- ity create numerous stagnant water sources where mosqui- toes, like the Anopheles mos- quito, can lay their eggs and larvae. # Time to unite as a nation & fight terrorism with one voice: Bali Bhagat

*Calls for decisive action against terrorism*

Senior BJP leader and former Minister Bali Bhagat has strongly criticized the remarks made by former J&K Governor Satyapal Malik regarding the tragic Pahalgam terror attack, in which 28 Hindu tourists lost their lives in a brutal assault carried out by Pakistan-sponsored terrorists. Expressing deep anguish and anger over the heinous act, Bali Bhagat said that while security lapses may occur, it is unacceptable to undermine the gravity of such attacks or politicize national security. “This is indeed a lapse in security,” he acknowledged, “but the real question is—how long will innocent people contin-

ue to live under the shadow of terror? For how many more years must we tolerate this bloodshed?” The senior BJP leader said the time has come to crush terrorism from its very roots. “We want to see a Jammu and Kashmir where people can move freely, without fear, just like they did before 1989. To ensure that, we must not only kill terrorists but also bury the ideology and the breeding grounds that give rise to them,” he asserted. Bali Bhagat demanded that the ‘factory of terrorism’ operating across the border must be shut down permanently. “Pakistan has become a hub for exporting terror. The world must realize that it is not just India’s problem—it

is a global threat. The time has come to isolate Pakistan and remove this menace from the face of the earth.” He added that the people of India—140 crore strong—stand firmly with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his decisive leadership. “There is a growing senti- ment across the nation to settle this issue once and for all. India is not weak, and we will not remain silent when our innocent civilians are tar- geted.” The former Minister also called upon all political leaders to refrain from mak- ing irresponsible statements that demoralize security forces or provide fodder to enemy propaganda. “This is the time to unite as a nation and fight terrorism with one voice,” he concluded.
