Crime Branch Kashmir hosts cyber fraud awareness programme to boost investigative expertise

In response to the sharp escalation in cyber fraud incidents, Crime Branch Kashmir (now EOW) organized a focused awareness programme on Cyber Frauds, Cybersecurity, and Information Technology at Crime Headquarters, J&K, Srinagar. The primary objective of the programme was to strengthen the investigative capabilities and technical proficiency of officers engaged in handling cybercrime investigations.
