London-bound AI plane with 242 on board crashes near Ahmedabad airport, chances of survivors slim

AHMEDABAD, JUN 12:

An Ahmedabad-London Air India plane carrying 242 passengers and crew crashed into a medical college complex here minutes after takeoff on Thursday, possibly killing all on board in one of the country's worst air tragedies. There was no official count of those killed even hours after the Boeing 787 Dreamliner (AI171) crashed in the city civil hospital and BJ Medical College near the Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport and burst into a ball of fire.As rescuers struggled to find survivors in the charred wreckage and pull out the injured, many of them with grievous burns, officials tried to assess the human magnitude of the disaster.



Amarnath Yatra 2025: Around 125 Langars to be set up for pilgrims

As preparations are in full swing for an upcoming Shri Amarnath Yatra starting from July 3, this year around 125 langars (community kitchen) will be set up from Lakhanpur (gateway to J&K) to the cave shrine situated in South Kashmir Himalayas. Official sources said that nearly 125 langars will be set up from Lakhanpur to the cave shrine, including on the twin Pahalgam and Baltal routes. They said that the trucks car-

infrastructural equipment to install sheds will start reaching Jammu and Kashmir from June 15. "The process of installing langars will be completed by the end of this month," they said. This year, the 38-day-long yatra starting from July 3 will conclude on August 9, on the day of Raksha Bandhan. The first batch will leave from Jammu on July 2.Officials said that apart from the Yatra routes, more than 50 langars will be installed from Lakhanpur to Srinagar and Pahalgam and Baltal after being permitted by the Amarnath Shrine Board to the langar organisations. Record booking in Katra-Srinagar Vande Bharat till June 26 in two Vande

The Katra-Srinagar Vande Bharat Express has received a huge response with record bookings in the past six days, while seats have also been booked in advance for the next two weeks.Prime Minister Narendra Modi on June 6 officially flagged off the Katra-Srinagar Vande Bharat from Katra and dedithe Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla (USBRL) rail link to the nation. "The train is completely packed for the next two weeks," said a railway official. "No seat is available

Bharat Express trains running from Katra to Srinagar and vice versa," he added.He added that seats have also been booked for the month of July, adding, "The annual Amarnath Yatra is starting from July 3, and a heavy rush is expected in view of that. "He said that apart from tourists and pilgrims, a large number of locals are also travelling by the rail that covers the distance in three hours.Former chief minister National Conference Dr president Farooq Abdullah also travelled to Katra from Srinagar in Vande

Bharat and paid obeisance at Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine. He expressed that it was his dream to travel by train from Srinagar, and it has been fulfilled.

Abdullah hoped tourism would flourish in Jammu and Kashmir with the start of the train. The USBRL project provided seamless rail connectivity between the Kashmir Valley and the rest of the country.
