

KCC&I hosts interactive session with Joint Commissioner of Income Tax, senior officials from ITD

JAMMU, JUN 13:

The Kashmir Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KCC&I) on Thursday hosted an interactive session at its Chamber Office on Residency Road, with Dr. Ruveda Salam, Joint Commissioner of Income Tax J&K, along with senior officials from the Income Tax Department. The session was attended by office bearers, executive members and chartered accountants. The meeting provided a platform for a meaningful exchange of ideas and concerns between the business community and the tax authorities.

President KCC&I, Javid Ahmad Tenga, welcomed the officials and presented a comprehensive overview of the prevailing business environment in Kashmir. He highlighted the pressing issues being faced by traders



and industrialists, particularly in relation to tax compliance, assessments, and procedural delays.

One of the key grievances raised by the members was that appeal cases and exemption hearings for Kashmir-based assesses are being held in Chandigarh and Jammu, creating unnecessary inconvenience. The Chamber stressed the need for these matters to be heard in

Srinagar to ensure easier access and timely resolution.

The discussion focused on the concerns surrounding Advance Tax, the deadline for which falls on June 15. KCC&I members pointed out that tax collections in the current quarter are likely to be lower due to the noticeable dip in business and economic activity following the April 22 incident, which had adversely affected market

sentiment and operations.

The members also flagged the need for better coordination and joint sessions between the KCCI, Income Tax and GST departments to streamline compliance processes and address overlapping issues. The idea of holding regular joint metering or facilitation meetings was proposed to iron out differences and ensure a better understanding of tax provi-

sions among stakeholders.

Dr Ruveda Salam listened patiently to all the issues and assured the gathering that the concerns raised by KCC&I would be taken seriously and efforts would be made to resolve them in a time-bound manner. She also elaborated on the key points related to TDS, Advance Tax, and quick disposal of appeals, and encourage the members to proactively engage with the Department through formal channels. KCCI stressed upon opening Income Tax ward for dealing with cases enjoying exemption in Srinagar which currently were located in Chandigarh & Jammu. The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks to the visiting officials and a collective commitment by KCC&I and the tax authorities to foster a supportive tax environment for businesses in the Valley.

Police conducts inspection drive on Sim vendors in entire Doda District, record taken for detailed analysis

In a proactive initiative to enhance security and tackle issues related to unauthorized SIM card distribution, Doda Police on the directions of SSP Doda Sh. Sandeep Mehta JKPS, District Police Doda conducted a comprehensive inspection drive targeting SIM card vendor outlets across the district. The initiative aims to strengthen the verification process for new SIM registrations to curb the misuse of mobile connectivity. During the inspection, vendors were directed to maintain proper records of all issued SIM cards including customer details and to follow strict KYC (Know Your Customer) protocols before issuing SIM cards. The vendors were also instructed to prohibit the sale of fake or pre-activated SIM cards and ensure compliance with all guidelines issued by the Department of Telecommunication (DoT). The day long drive for 30 teams were constituted inspected about 94 vendors throughout the District. The drive also highlighted the importance of maintaining detailed records for recharges, duplicate SIM issuance, and logs for lost or damaged SIM cards along with associated customer details. Vendors were warned against irregular practices and strict legal action was emphasized for any violations detected during future inspections. Some record of the SIM vendors was also taken for detailed analysis and verification.

Illegal transportation of bovine animals foiled by Poonch Police

NSF flays JU for misusing students' money, no roadmap for providing basic facilities to students

National Secular Forum(NSF) today strongly criticized the administration of Jammu University saying that students' money is being misused and demanded high level inquiry against Jammu University authorities from the JK Government. While addressing the media person, NSF Secretary, Vikshay Vashist said that despite the scorching hot weather, the water coolers have not been provided in the university campus due to which students are facing problems of drinking water. Only one or two water coolers have been installed in the entire campus, which are inadequate to cope up with the drinking water requirement of the large number of students visiting campus daily.

He also said that the administration

is not paying any attention to problems of students and money of students is being misused with impunity. He said that vehicles cannot enter the entire campus but the administration is not paying any attention to the issue. How can two-three autos deployed in campus can cover the entire campus during on-going hot weather as students and staff are in trouble while walking on foot from one corner to other corner of the campus he questioned, adding that the Varsity Administration is not paying any attention to address this issue.

He added that ever since the university was formed, Academic Council meetings were being held in main Campus but this time Vice Chancellor is getting it done in Badarwah campus. He further said that 20 to 25 lakhs are being spent on Academic

Council functioning/meetings. From where this huge money is generated, is a matter of investigation. He said that the meetings held in Jammu University Campus used to get over in 3-4 hours and the cost used to be only 40-50 thousands.

Questioning the wisdom of JU Authority, he said that now 20 and 25 lakhs are being spent on these meetings as it takes 3 days time i. e. Two days for to and fro and one day for the meeting which involves transportation, accommodation and food for those attending meeting much away from Jammu University campus to Badharwah campus. He further said that the undergraduate admissions in Distance Education Department have not been done yet and no attention is being paid to the problems of students, he claimed

adding that in the last two years, there has been a decline in the admissions to PG Departments but No attention is being paid to address this burning issue of students, he added.

He further alleged that the Vice Chancellor is busy providing benefits to some blue eyed officials out of the way in the University in a desperate effort to save his chair while VC has no time to focus for providing basic facilities of the students. He appealed to the Chief Minister and the Higher Education Minister that they should take cognizance of all these issues and the high level investigation should be ordered to probe the matter on priority basis. Among those who were present on the occasion include Gourav Partap Singh University unit preddident, Roshan Sharma, Abhishek uppal And Ankush.
