## MLA nomination case couldn't be taken up, next date to be fixed next week

The significant case regarding nomination of five MLAs scheduled to be taken up today, could not be listed in view of the non-availability of the bench due to proposed judicial conference in Srinagar on July 27th.

The PIL filed by Former MLC and Chief Spokesperson JK Congress Mr Ravinder Sharma Advocate challenging the provisions & powers of nomination of five MLAs by the Lt. Governor to the Legislative Assembly of J&K UT ,was scheduled to be taken up today.However the bench couldn't be constituted due to movement of hon'ble judges to participate in a

judicial conference at Srinagar scheduled for Sunday. On the last date in the case on April 30th , the Court had granted last & final opportunity of four weeks to the GOI to file reply in matter and had fixed July 25th , the date for final hearing. The special Division Bench of Justice Sanjeev Kumar and Justice Rajesh Sekhri is hearing the important matter since October last year.

The respondents including GOI has failed to file the reply to the averments in the petition and the court was apprised by the Counsels for Petitioner about this fact and the delay being caused on this count.Upon this the Division Bench had granted last &

final opportunity of 4 weeks to the respondent to file reply to the petition & four weeks, thereafter to the Petitioner to file rejoinder to the same & fixed the matter to be listed for hearing today.

However no reply has been filed by the UOI and the other respondents ,so far as per Petitioner. The case is hotly contested as Senior Supreme Court lawyer Dr Abhishek Manu Singhvi alongwith D K Khajuria, SM Chaudhary is appearing for the Petitioner while Addl Solicitor General Tushar Mehta is appearing for GOI alongwith ASGI Vishal Sharma for the respondents. The next date in the case shall now fixed next week after seeking instructions from the bench.

## Shrine Board launches green initiative at GMS Panthal

## Police books 03 drug peddlers under PIT NDPS Act in Sopore

In its sustained campaign against drug trafficking and in line with its zero-tolerance approach, Police in Sopore have booked three habitual drug peddlers under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (PIT NDPS Act) for their persistent involvement in narcotics trade. The following accused persons have been lodged in different jails; Abdul Hamid Lone son of Mohammad Ramzan Lone resident of Tujjar Sharief, is presently lodged at Kot Bhalwal Jail. Javid Ahmad Wani son of Abdul Subhan Wani resident of Tujjar Sharief, is presently lodged at Central Jail Amphala, Jammu. Similarly, Firdous Ahmad Dar son of Mohammad Sultan Dar resident of Reban Sopore, is presently lodged at District Jail Udhampur. Despite repeated FIRs and preventive actions in the past, these individuals continued their involvement in the narcotics network, posing a serious threat to public safety and youth welfare. After detailed surveillance and dossier preparation, competent authorities issued detention orders under PIT NDPS Act. As part of the ongoing crackdown, Police in Sopore has identified 20 more repeat offenders involved in drug peddling who are likely to face similar action under PIT NDPS in the coming days.Police reiterates its firm resolve to dismantle the entire narcotics ecosystem and urges the public to remain vigilant and cooperate by reporting any suspicious drug-related activity.

## Police conduct wild cannabis destruction drive in Budgam

Kilam urged Home Minister Amit Shah and Lt Governor Manoj Sinha to take strong action against officials involved in the killing of tribal youth.“FIR has been registered in the killing of Mohammad Pervaiz. Kilam strongly condemn this intolerable targeting of tribal community across the State under the pretexts of encroachment, drugs, and cattle smuggling. This clearly reveals a strong conspiracy against tribals. What was the fault of Parvez Ahmed? Why was he murdered.

ed more than three years of service in hard zones, which, according to transfer norms and policy guidelines, qualifies them for relocation to accessible areas. Yet, their cases continue to remain pending due to administrative inertia,” Bhat said. He stressed that the delay in the release of the Annual Transfer List for 2025 is not only demoralizing for the teaching community but is also affecting the overall quality of education delivery, as fatigued and overburdened staff continue to work in challenging areas without rotation or support. He added that the timely transfer of such employees is essential for maintaining work-life balance, preventing burnout, and upholding fairness in the system. The JKTF Vice President noted that the School Education Department had previously issued guidelines indicating that the Annual Transfer Drive would be conducted in a transparent and time-bound manner, with special priority given to hardship postings, medical cases, and female employees. However, despite repeated representations and follow-ups, the lists have not been published, leaving affected staff in a state of uncertainty and frustration. “In the past few months, we have submitted memoran-

dums, held meetings with concerned officials, and raised the issue on multiple platforms. Unfortunately, no concrete action has been taken so far. The teachers serving in the hard zones of districts like Poonch, Rajouri, Doda, Kishtwar, Ramban, and Reasi,Kathua are among the worst affected. They deserve fair and humane treatment from the department,” Bhat asserted. He also made a humble request to the Hon’ble Education Minister, Smt. Sakina Itoo, to personally intervene and ensure that the long-pending transfer list is finalized and issued at the earliest. “Madam Minister has always been sensitive to the concerns of educators. We are hopeful that under her leadership, justice will be delivered to those who have served in the most trying conditions,” Bhat said.

The JKTF further appealed to the Director School Education Jammu to act promptly and facilitate the timely issuance of the transfer orders. “We believe in dialogue and institutional channels, and we expect that the administration will honor the commitment made to teachers. The delay is not just a policy lapse—it’s a human issue affecting the morale and motivation of hundreds of teachers,” Bhat added.
