Chief Minister Omar Abdullah today announced that the government has decided to provide five marlas of land each to all flood-affected families who have

been rendered homeless and have suffered both on account of their houses destroyed and left without land due to landslides and flashfloods which has taken away their everything so that they are able to construct

their dwelling units on the allotted land.

The Chief Minister made this announcement while interacting with residents of Duggain, Billawar, whose houses and livelihoods were severely impacted by the

recent flooding. Earlier, he conducted an aerial survey of the flood-affected areas in the district, accompanied by MLA Bani, Dr. Rameshwar Singh.

Assuring people of all possible assistance, Omar Abdullah directed the administration to ensure timely relief and rehabilitation measures. "The year 2025 has brought immense devastation to Jammu and Kashmir from the dry spell in March-April to incessant rains, flash floods, and landslides in August-September," he said. Javed Rana calls on Union Jal Shakti Minister CR Patil

Seeks Union Govt's assistance in post-flood restoration, continuous support for Jal Jeevan Mission implementation in J&K

Jal Shakti Minister, Javed Ahmed Rana, today called on Union Minister for Jal Shakti,

about the extensive damage to water supply and irrigation infrastructure caused by recent flash floods in the J&K and the urgent need for sustained financial support to complete ongoing schemes under the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM). During the meeting, Javed Rana conveyed the gravity of the situation following the unprecedented flash floods that hit various parts of Jammu & Kashmir during August and September 2025. He informed the Minister that the floods severely disrupted public life, damaged essential infrastructure, and caused large-scale destruction to the water supply, irrigation and

Violence erupted in Ladakh due to Centre's 'wrong policies': Mehbooba Mufti

PDP president Mehbooba Mufti on Thursday alleged the violent protests in the Union Territory of Ladakh erupted due to the "wrong policies" of the central government. The Union home ministry had made many promises with the people of Ladakh but nothing came out of it over the past six years, Mufti told reporters, adding that what happened on

Wednesday was a breach in their level of tolerance. The former chief minister said the people of Ladakh have been striving for inclusion under the Sixth Schedule in a bid to protect their identity, culture, land and jobs. "They were disappointed that nothing was happening... If people from outside come there in large numbers, what will remain of them? They are just a few lakh in number," she said.

Mufti said the Centre should ponder over the developments in Ladakh, where violence broke out on Wednesday. "The Centre should think over it. A happy and prosperous place like Ladakh is burning today. Ladakh has remained peaceful even when Kashmir and Jammu were engulfed in violence. Ladakhis played a stellar role in the Kargil War," she added.
