Dr. Piyush Singla reviews progress, implementation of IT initiatives across J&K

Secretary, Information Technology (IT), Dr.Piyush Singla, today chaired a meeting to review the progress of various ongoing initiatives of department across Jammu and Kashmir.

During the meeting, the Secretary directed the officers that a mobile application for e-office be developed on the lines of the standards adopted by the Andhra Pradesh. He instructed the Finance Department to initiate concurrence for the establishment of a Mini Security Operations Centre (SoC), and further, to create a dedicated budgetary head for the same. It was also decided that, as an interim arrangement, all websites and applications shall be hosted on the NIC MeghRaj Cloud for a period of one year. The JaKeGA was directed to submit monthly optimization reports and prepare a comprehensive 6-12 month proposal for augmentation of the State Data Centre (SDC), ensuring its optimal utilization.



On the cyber security front, Dr. Piyush Singla emphasized the need to expedite security audits of websites, including three NIC-managed websites, and directed that the migration of SICOP systems be completed and made live by 30th September 2025.

To ensure continuous monitoring, daily activity updates on CCMP, eSAM, and IT infrastructure shall henceforth be submitted by 7:00 PM.

Additionally, a proposal on WhatsAppbased integration shall be prepared, with comparative insights drawn from the models adopted in Andhra Pradesh and Odisha.

Secretary reviewed the progress of the SaKOON application, which is presently in its final stages of development, with a demonstration scheduled before the Home Department. Directions were issued to SeMT to seek

support from MeitY for establishing six Data Analytics Labs across two ITIs in Jammu and Srinagar, and to replicate an AI Tools proposal within J&K. The revised Cyber Security Contingency Plan (CSCP) was instructed to be submitted by 1st October 2025.

Further, the IT Cell was tasked with the development of an AI-enabled "Minutes of Meeting" application, undertaking de-duplication of services on the eUNNAT platform, and publishing monthly knowledge products, including a Coffee Table Book and an IT Magazine.

As part of outreach activities, Secretary directed the CSC and the Additional Secretary (DB) to coordinate with the Information Department for dissemination of information under the SeWA Parv campaign. With regard to DigiLocker, all departments were instructed to prepare issue-wise formats covering challenges, on-boarding of legacy data, and corresponding action

and assured the Committee that all pending assurances would be addressed at the earliest. Principal Secretary PWD reaffirmed the Department's commitment to take up all highlighted works on top pri-

In his opening remarks, Chairman Sajad Gani Lone emphasized that Committee's primary mandate is to scrutinize the assurances, promises, and undertakings made by Ministers on the floor of the House and assess their implementation within the stipulated timeframe.

Satish Sharma reviews winter preparedness of FCS&CA Deptt.

Also assesses stocking of essentials, smart PDS implementation across J&K

Minister for Food, Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs (FCS&CA), Information Technology, Youth Services and Sports, Satish Sharma held a detailed review meeting here today to assess the overall preparedness of FCS&CA department for ensuring uninterrupted availability of essential commodities during the forthcoming winter months in Jammu and Kashmir. The meeting was attended by Commissioner Secretary FCS&CA, Saurabh Bhagat; Director FCS&CA Kashmir, Owais Ahmad and Directors Kashmir Division besides repof Food resentatives Corporation of India(FCI).

Director FCS&CA Jammu, Rifat Kohli, Director Finance (FCS&CA), and all Assistant Directors of Jammu Division joined the deliberations through virtual mode.

At the outset, the Minister sought a comparative analysis of the dumping position of foodgrains during the month of October last year vis-à-vis the present status, and directed that adequate foodgrain stocks be positioned well in advance in snow-bound and far-flung areas. He emphasized that stocking should be sufficient to cater to at least six months of public requirement, considering the frequent road blockades and disruptions during peak winter.

Sharma reviewed the availability of petroleum products, including LPG, and instructed that special measures be taken to ensure dumping of adequate stocks in remote regions before the onset of winter. He stressed that priority must be accorded to LPG and kerosene supplies, given their critical importance for cooking and heating in sub-zero temperatures.

further The Minister reviewed the transportation mechanisms available in snow-bound areas, noting that reliance on conventional modes often leads to delays. He asked the officers to prepare contingency plans involving alternate transport systems, including load carriers, sledges, and coordinated movement through RTC vehicles, wherever feasible, to guarantee smooth supplies.

While reviewing the functioning of Smart PDS, the Minister acknowledged the benefits of transparency and efficiency it brings but took serious note of public grievances related to its implementation. He instructed that dedicated grievance redressal cells be strengthened at district levels to promptly

resolve consumer issues. On the quality of rice and other foodgrains distributed through PDS, the Minister reiterated the Government's zero-tolerance policy towards sub-standard supplies. He directed field officers to conduct frequent inspections at depots and Fair Price Shops and ensure that only qualityassured stocks reach the bene-

The progress of the e-KYC exercise was also reviewed threadbare during the meet-

Satish Sharma underlined that completion of e-KYC is vital for eliminating bogus beneficiaries, preventing leakages, and ensuring rightful targeting of subsidies. He asked officers to expedite this process with active support from local administration. He asked them to organise awareness campaigns to encourage beneficiaries to complete their authentication at the earliest.

Reiterating Government's commitment to the welfare of the people, Minister said, "The primary responsibility of the administration is to ensure that no household in J&K suffers shortage of essentials during the winter. All necessary arrangements must be put in place well in advance, especially for those living in remote and snow-bound areas who face the brunt of harsh weather." The Minister appreciated the efforts of the Department in streamlining supplies but urged all officers to work in mission mode for timely completion of stocking and efficient implementation

Govt seeks local support to revive Namda Craft GI Tag and Flagship Schemes Aim to Revive Tradition, facilitate Artisans

In response to a news article published in a local Urdu daily on September 24, a spokesper-

son of the Directorate of Handicrafts & Handloom, Kashmir, has reiterated that the Government is undertaking a series of concerted measures for the revival and promotion of languishing crafts, with special focus on the traditional Namda craft.

The spokesperson stated that Namda has recently been accorded Geographical Indication (GI) registration under the Geographical Indications Goods (Registration and Protection) Act, 1999, a landmark achievement that safeguards the authenticity of the craft while strengthening its competitive standing against

cheaper, machine-made alternatives. The GI tag is expected to serve as a catalyst in revitalizing this centuries-old tradition and enhancing its market visibility at both national and international levels.

In pursuit of this objective, the Directorate has intensified its outreach by encouraging master artisans to avail the benefits of the Department's flagship Karkhandar Scheme, aimed at capacity building, skill development and knowledge transfer to younger generations. District offices have also been directed to actively engage pass-out trainees to strengthen the grassroots implementation of the scheme. At present, the Department is running nine Elementary and two Advanced Training Centres for Namda, creating a strong framework for skill

development and knowledge transfer. Redoubling its efforts for

revival of the craft, under the CAPEX Budget 2025-26, an amount of ?26.50 lakh has been earmarked for the repair and restoration of the Carding Machine at the UNDP facility, a step that will guarantee uninterrupted availability of quality raw material and thereby reinforce the production base for Namda artisans.

The spokesperson appealed to the public to support the Government's "Vocal for Local" initiative by buying felted Namdas, emphasizing that collective patronage is essential to provide a level playing field to Namda artisans and to ensure the revival of this unique craft, which forms an integral part of Kashmir's cultural heritage.
