# Next-Gen GST is game-changer for India's economy: Priya Sethi JAMMU BULLETIN NEWS AKHNOOR, SEP 25:

Addressing the issue of connectivity, Sawhney stated that they strongly demanded the urgent restoration of the road from Kattal Batal to Baba Bhair Devta, which holds immense significance. He further stated that alternative workaround such as seeking help from the Army in construction of a temporary bridge should also be looked at. The devotees and locals are eagerly awaiting the restoration of this lifeline, he added.

Since complete restoration will take time, temporary arrangements be made in the meantime to ensure accessibility for the public, he said. These roads are essential not just for daily commutes but also for religious and social gatherings, and delays in restoration cause immense difficulty to

The Deputy Commissioner Jammu heard Sawhney's concerns patiently and assured that the administration would take appropriate steps to address the highlighted issues. # Balvinder calls for immediate policy to regulate unchecked growth of E-Rickshaws and E-Autos in Jammu

Balvinder Singh, renowned RTI Activist and Social Activist, has urged the Secretary Transport, Jammu & Kashmir Union Territory (JKUT), and the Deputy Commissioner Jammu to urgently formulate a comprehensive policy to address the unchecked growth of e-rickshaws and e-autos in Jammu. Singh highlighted the pressing issues arising from the unregulated movement and unlimited sale of these vehicles, pointing out that the recent influx of new e-autos, following the proliferation of e-rickshaws, has further aggravated the city's traffic

Singh emphasized that, apart from a few wide roads,

most of Jammu city comprises narrow streets. This infrastructure is ill-equipped to handle the rapidly increasing number of e-rickshaws and eautos. As a result, residents are now grappling with frequent and prolonged traffic jams, making it increasingly difficult for citizens to move freely-even within local markets. He stressed that the situation is growing untenable, with public inconvenience and road safety concerns mounting daily.

With the onset of winter approaching, Singh warned of an impending crisis, as Jammu annually receives an influx of more than two lakh people from the Kashmir Valley and hill districts like Poonch, Rajouri, Doda, and Bhaderwah. This seasonal

migration swells the city's population for five to six months, further straining the already overloaded road infrastructure and threatening to render Jammu a perpetual "Jam City."

Singh has called on the JKUT administration-especially the District Magistrate Jammu-to immediately engage all stakeholders in a thorough discussion to devise an effective mechanism to regulate the growth of e-rickshaws and e-autos. He reiterated his appeal for urgent restrictions on the unchecked mushrooming of these vehicles, emphasizing the need for balanced, sustainable solutions that ensure smooth traffic flow and safeguard the interests of all residents and
