## DHSJ conducts extensive review of SNCU and health schemes at District Hospital Ramban

Director Health Services, Jammu Dr. Abdul Hamid Zargar conducted a comprehensive visit to District Hospital Ramban, wherein the functioning of the Special Newborn Care Unit (SNCU) remained the central focus along with a detailed review of various ongoing health schemes. During the visit, DHSJ inspected the SNCU facilities and reviewed the availability and operational status of neonatal care equipment, adequacy of trained medical and nursing staff, maintenance of infection control protocols, and overall quality of care being provided to sick and low-birth-weight newborns. Emphasis was laid on strict adherence to standard treatment guidelines, regular monitoring of admitted neonates, and strengthening of referral and transport mechanisms to ensure timely and effective neonatal care. The Director also interacted with doctors, nursing staff, and paramedical personnel and stressed the importance of strengthening maternal and child health services under various health schemes. The efforts of the hospital staff were appreciated, and the administration



was directed to address gaps observed during the inspection. The Director also reviewed the implementation of major national and UT health programmes including RMNCH+A, Janani Suraksha Yojana (JSY), Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakram (JSSK), National Health Mission (NHM) initiatives, Universal Immunization Programme, NCD screening programmes, and other public health schemes. Officers were directed to ensure effective service delivery, proper record maintenance, and maximum beneficiary coverage under all schemes.

An interaction meeting was held with the hospital administration, medical officers, nursing staff, and paramedical personnel, during which DHSJ appreciated their dedication and efforts in deliver-

ing healthcare services in challenging terrain.

Directions were issued to promptly address gaps observed during the inspection and to further strengthen critical care and maternal-child health services. Infrastructure facilities, availability of essential drugs, diagnostics, and patient-centric services were also assessed during the visit. DHSJ stressed the need for improving coordination between District Hospital and peripheral health institutions for seamless referral services, especially in emergency and neonatal cases. The visit underscored the Health Department’s commitment to enhancing healthcare infrastructure, improving neonatal outcomes, and ensuring equitable, accessible, and quality healthcare services for the people of Ramban district.

## ADG Armed reviews functioning of IRP 18th Battalion at DPL, facilities inaugurated

## Movement Kalki mourns martyrdom of Army Personnel in Doda accident, demands high-level probe

Movement Kalki expressed deep grief over the tragic accident in District Doda, where an Indian Army vehicle met with an accident, leading to the martyrdom of 10 brave soldiers and injuries to 11 others. The heartbreaking incident has shocked the entire nation and plunged the country into mourning. To pay homage to the fallen heroes, a condolence and tribute ceremony was organized today at the Movement Kalki Office. Members observed two minutes of silence, offered prayers for the eternal peace of the departed souls, and conveyed heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families. Movement Kalki stated that the soldiers attained martyrdom while faithfully discharging their duties towards the nation. At a time when sensitive regions continue to face threats from militant and

anti-national elements, the supreme sacrifice of these brave hearts stands as a powerful symbol of courage, duty, and patriotism. The organization firmly asserted that the fallen soldiers should be officially accorded the status of martyrs, as they laid down their lives in service of the nation. The organization further emphasized that it is the moral duty of every citizen to respect, honour, and stand in solidarity with the armed forces, who protect the country under the most challenging and dangerous conditions. Raising serious concerns, Movement Kalki also demanded a thorough and transparent investigation into the incident.

Noting that the accident occurred in a hilly and sensitive area, and keeping in view the prevailing security scenario, the organization stressed the need to ascertain whether the tragedy was

purely accidental or if other factors were involved. Such a major loss of lives, it stated, warrants detailed scrutiny. Movement Kalki urged the Hon’ble Union Home Minister, Amit Shah, to order a high-level inquiry to determine the exact cause of the incident and to fix accountability, so that similar tragedies can be prevented in the future.
