**J&K Govt nominates officers for cyber security workshop**

**JAMMU BULLETIN BUREAU SRINAGAR, JUN 23:** The Jammu and Kashmir Government has nominated senior officers, technical experts and cybersecurity professionals from various departments and agencies to participate in a State-Level Workshop on "Strengthening Cyber Security Frameworks for State Data" scheduled to be held on June 24, 2026, at the University of Kashmir. According to Government Order No. 1111-JK(GAD) of 2026 dated June 23, 2026, issued by the General Administration Department (IT Initiatives Section), sanction has been accorded for the nomination of officers from more than 40 departments and institutions to attend the workshop aimed at enhancing cyber security preparedness and safeguarding government data infrastructure. The workshop has been organized following a proposal received from the Information Technology Department and is intended to strengthen cyber resilience, improve data protection mechanisms and promote best practices in information security across government institutions. **J-K govt should observe 'holocaust day' to remember victims of Pak army's 1947 raids: Chugh**

**JAMMU BULLETIN BUREAU SRINAGAR, JUN 23:** BJP leader Tarun Chugh on Tuesday said the Jammu and Kashmir government should observe a 'holocaust day' in memory of the victims of the Pakistan army who raided the then princely state in 1947 disguised as tribal people. "The Pakistan army, disguised as tribal people, attacked here and killed Kashmiri citizens, raped the daughters here, continuously looted Jammu and Kashmir for 96 hours, killing and plundering. It was a holocaust. "The J&K government should observe a 'Holocaust Day' on this," Chugh, national general secretary of the BJP told. The BJP leader was here to pay tributes to the founder of Jansangh, Syama Prasad Mookerjee, on his 73rd death anniversary. He said a documentary should be made to depict the events and it should be shown to everyone. "Books should be written about it. The records of the killings from that era should be brought to the people," he said.
